## RE: Submission on the FCCC (Control of Prices for Marina Management Services for Passengers on Commercial Ships and Cargo Transportation) Order 2021

Bula Vinaka and Warm Greetings from the Consumer Council of Fiji!!

The Consumer Council of Fiji (hereafter referred to as the 'Council') welcomes the Fijian Competition and Consumer Commission (FCCC) request for our submission on the FCCC (Control of Prices for Marina Management Services for Passengers on Commercial Ships and Cargo Transportation) Order 2021. It is for this purpose that we wish to make our submission with the following recommendations and we sincerely hope that the issues/recommendations raised are given due consideration which are in the interest of consumer justice and fairness.

## 1. Fuel Price of Diesoline

Diesel is one of the major inputs that often dictates the varying price or cost of providing transport services. Whilst we understand that the global fuel prices continue to dictate the domestic diesel prices, our investigations reveals that the price has declined 7 times in the last 10 months of 2023 when compared to the increase with lowest price registered at \$2.22.



2. Shipping capacity and competition

Competition remains quite restricted despite cargo and passenger shipping capacity increasing

locally with the importation of new vessels. Often evident, the market conditions for inter-

island routes are that the uneconomical routes are franchised to small operators. Some of these

small operators rely on grocery retailing as a subsidiary business to sustain their services. For

instance, Victoria Marine Limited operates the MV Brianna and services the Southern Lau

group (including Vanuavatu, Nayau, Laekba, Oneata, Moce, Komo, Namuka and Kabara). The

Valesasa Transport Company operates the MV Uluinabukelevu that services the franchise

schemes outer reaches of Kadavu Islands. The South Island Shipping Services operates MV

Liahona that services the franchise schemes of Southern Lau. The Tokalau Shipping operates

the MV Princess Fever that services the franchise schemes for Northern Lau. All these

operators have to compete against a giant in Goundar Shipping almost along the same route.

These inter-island services are operating in a monopolistic market situation, and may not be

ready for deregulation as it could open up the market to exploitation. Further to this, the

geographical makeup of the Fiji Islands may not allow for the viability of open competition.

Initially, the Order 2015 (now Order 2021) was instituted based on the abovementioned

reasonings. The Council perceives that the situation has not changed presently to demand for

an alternate action.

Therefore, the Council recommends that the Order 2021 be extended.
